**Meeting of the Marion City Council

The Marion City Council met in Regular Session January 11, 2021 at 5:00 p.m. with Mayor Jared Byford presiding. Council members present were; Darrin Tabor, Phyllis Sykes, Donnie Arflack, Dwight Sherer, D'Anna Browning, and Mike Byford. PUBLIC COMMENTS

Lynda Dennis, Brad Wright, and Jeff Martin with Audubon Head Start were present at the council meeting asking permission to build a new Head Start between Rudd and Chapel Hill Road. Mr. Wright explained in detail to the council about the new facility. He answered any questions and concerns the council had pertaining to the new facility.

GOVERNMENT

Administrator Ledford advised the next step would be to measure the footage after identifying the streets needing repair. Council member Donnie Arflack suggested moving Chapel Hill Road up the list. A copy of list of streets is attached and made part of these minutes.

Alan Robinson, Eclipse Engineering, addressed the council to answer any questions and concerns they had with the new sewer plant project. Mr. Robinson advised the council the bid opening would be January 12, 2021 at 2:00 p.m. Mr. Robinson advised 9 contractors picked up drawings for the bid on the new sewer plant project. Mr. Robinson answered any questions and concerns the council had.
