

Special Called Meeting of the Marion City Council
Monday, October 27, 2025, at 5:00 PM

The Marion City Council met in special session on October 27, 2025, at 5:00 PM with Mayor Browning presiding. Council Members present were as follows: Randy Dunn, Taylor Davis, Dwight Sherer and Bobby Belt. City employees in attendance were as follows: Layten Croft, Cortny Cosby, Chief Bobby West, and Tanya Byers.

General Government

Mayor Browning presented a quote by Paul Davis for 805 North Weldon and stated the money for the estimate will come from the sewer fund. Mayor Browning stated Legal Service Officer Bart Frazer advised if the estimate was under \$30,000 and the money came from the sewer fund that a budget amendment was not necessary. Mayor Browning stated this was the third event in three years and stated that in the future homeowners must file a claim with their own insurance as well, and that will be a case-by-case basis. Bobby Belt questioned the exact cause of the sewer event. Mayor Browning stated Eugene Williams called late Friday night stating the cause as roots in the pipes. The Copeland's stated they had a quote in process from Allied Contracting with higher numbers including replacement cost. Mayor Browning advised that the city offered to clean up, not replace. The Copeland's voiced concerns, as this has been their home for 20 plus years. Mayor Browning advised the Copeland's to sue the city's insurance.

Mayor Browning accepted the resignation of Nikki (Conger) Meeks's from the Marion City Council, stating thirty days began today. Mayor Browning stated there will be a vote next meeting for the open seat.

Adjournment

There being no further business to come before the council, Randy Dunn made a motion to adjourn, seconded by Taylor Davis. The meeting was adjourned at 5:39 PM.
