

Resolution # 23-02

**WHEREAS** the City of Marion has experienced damage from severe thunderstorms, severe winter storms, tornadoes and flooding on many occasions in the past century, resulting in property loss, loss of life, economic hardships, and threats to public health and safety;

**WHEREAS** the Pennyryle Regional Hazard Mitigation Plan (the Plan) has been comprehensively reviewed and updated by the staff of the Pennyryle Area Development District, the members of the Pennyryle Regional Hazard Mitigation Council, and the people of the community;

**WHEREAS** the Plan recommends many hazard mitigation actions that will protect the people and property affected by the natural hazards that face the Pennyryle Area Development District; and

**WHEREAS** public meetings were held as required by law.

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** by the Mayor and the City Council of Marion that:

1. The Pennyryle Regional Hazard Mitigation Plan has hereby been adopted as an official plan of the Pennyryle counties and the jurisdictions within: Caldwell, Christian, Crittenden, Hopkins, Livingston, Lyon, Muhlenberg, Todd, and Trigg.

2. The respective officials identified in the strategy of the Plan are hereby directed to implement the recommended actions assigned to them. These officials will report quarterly on their activities, accomplishments, and progress to the Pennyryle Regional Hazard Mitigation Council.

3. The Pennyryle Regional Hazard Mitigation Council will provide annual progress reports on the status of implementation of the Plan to the Mayor and City Council of Marion.
